I William Throop of Bristol in the County of Bristol and State of Rhode Island & do hereby depose and say, that I hold the Office of Town Clerk of said Town, that upon application to me for Record-evidence of the Marriage of Amariah Richmond & Hannah Throop, I have made careful search of the books of Records in my custody, without being able to find the same - I further depose and say that upon a further search of the ancient record of births I find the following

" Hannah Throop daughter of Beddings Throop & Hannah his wife was born January 24<sup>th</sup> 1763"

Being the only Record I can find in reference to the said Hannah Richmond - I further depose and say that I am now in the 74<sup>th</sup> year of my age, and my belief is, that the said Amariah Richmond came from Saunter, Massachusetts to this town in the time of the War of the Revolution, and that he was married to the said Hannah Throop towards the latter part of the year 1780. - The said Hannah Throop who is now the widow of the said Amariah Richmond, is a relative of mine and I do well recollect, that they occupied

a part of the same tenement wherein my father  
lived in said Bristol - but left said Bristol  
some two or three years afterwards and removed  
to said Taunton, as I now think -

I further depose and say, that upon a  
further search of the Books and files in my  
possession I find that a tax was assessed  
upon the said Comariah Richmond here in  
the month of May 1781 - being the first Tax  
I find assessed against him, which is a strong  
reason why I believe he came here and was mar-  
ried the year previous that is in the year  
1780 - I also find he was again taxed here  
in 1782

## Declaration

In order to obtain the benefit of the third section of the Act of Congress of the 4th of July 1836

State of Vermont }  
Windsor County, ss. }

On this 3<sup>d</sup> day of June 1843 personally appeared before me David Pierce one of the assistant Justices of the County Court in Windsor County aforesaid Hannah Richmond a resident of Woodstock in said County aged eighty years who being first duly sworn according to law doth on her oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the Act of Congress passed July 4<sup>th</sup> 1836. That she is the widow of Amariah Richmond who was as she believes engaged as a private in actual service much of the time of the war during the revolution, but his particular tours of service and the length of each she is at this time unable to state. At the time of the commencement of the war he was a resident of Dartmouth Massachusetts and there first engaged in service in the

Mass. Line as she has since understood  
and now vividly believes for the term of  
eight months but in what Company and  
Regiment she knows not. He was next en-  
gaged as she now believes under a  
Capt. Washburn of Middleborough being the  
only Capt. name that she now recoll-  
ects while he was a resident of Mass.  
Sometime previous to her marriage to him  
in 1780 he took up his abode in Bristol Rhode-  
island where she resided ~~both~~ before and  
her marriage to him and for the space  
of two years or more afterwards. ~~Some~~  
where after his said marriage she  
well recollects his being several times en-  
gaged in the Rhode Island service during  
Guard duty and thinks that during  
one such tour he was under the com-  
mand of a Capt. Stanton for she knew  
him so say at the time and of which she  
feels entirely confident, well recollecting  
his absence from her in said service,  
but the amount or length of which she  
is entirely unable to state, and that as  
respects the services of her said husband  
she has no documentary evidence and  
must consequently rely on such proof as  
may be hereafter obtained.

- She further

declares that she was married to the said Amariah Richmond on the twenty first day of November last the year seven teen hundred and eighty, that her husband the afore said Amariah Richmond died on the thirtieth day of September eighteen hundred and twenty five and that she has remained a widow ever since that period as will more fully appear by reference to the proof herewith transmitted
